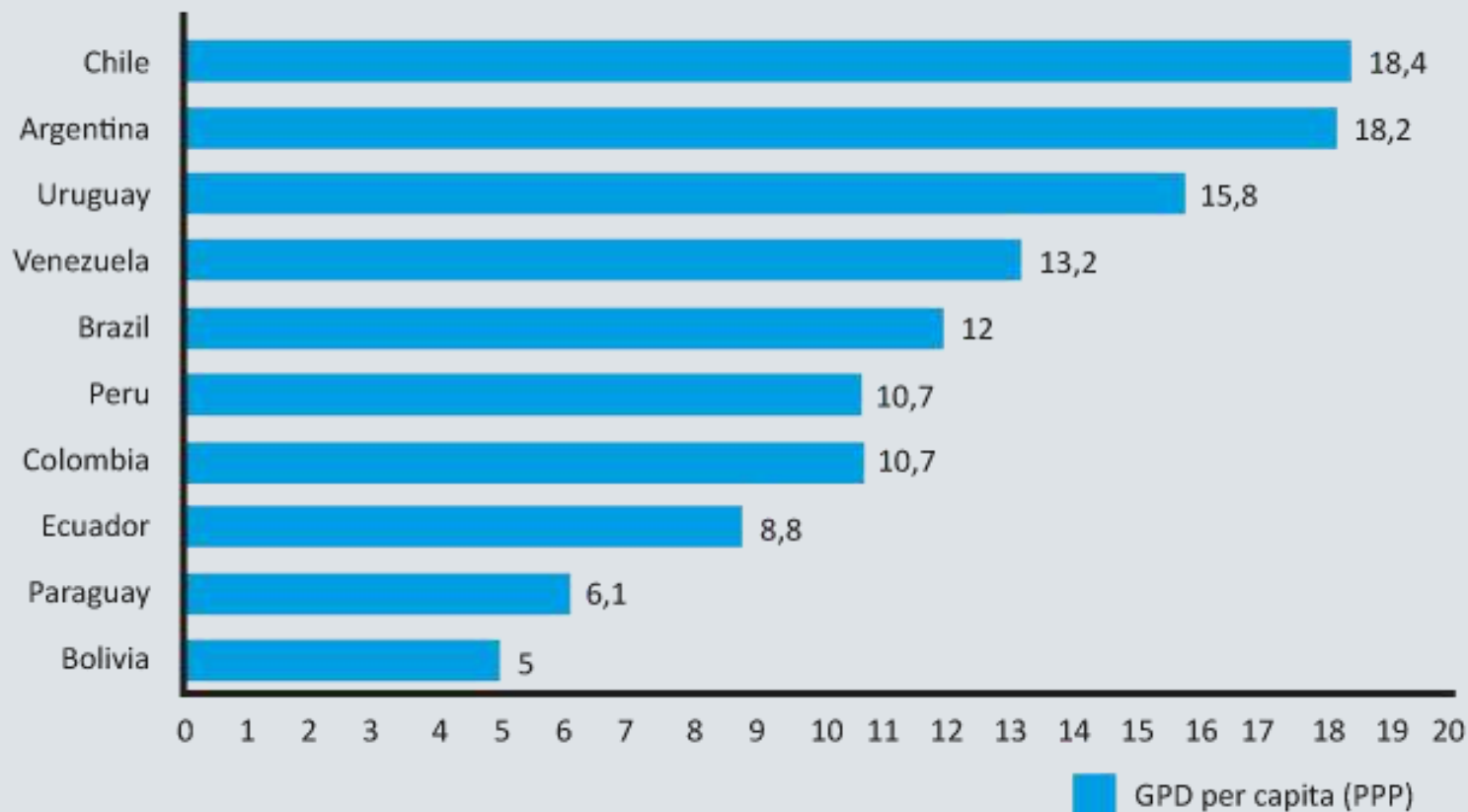

US\$18,419 GDP PER CAPITA

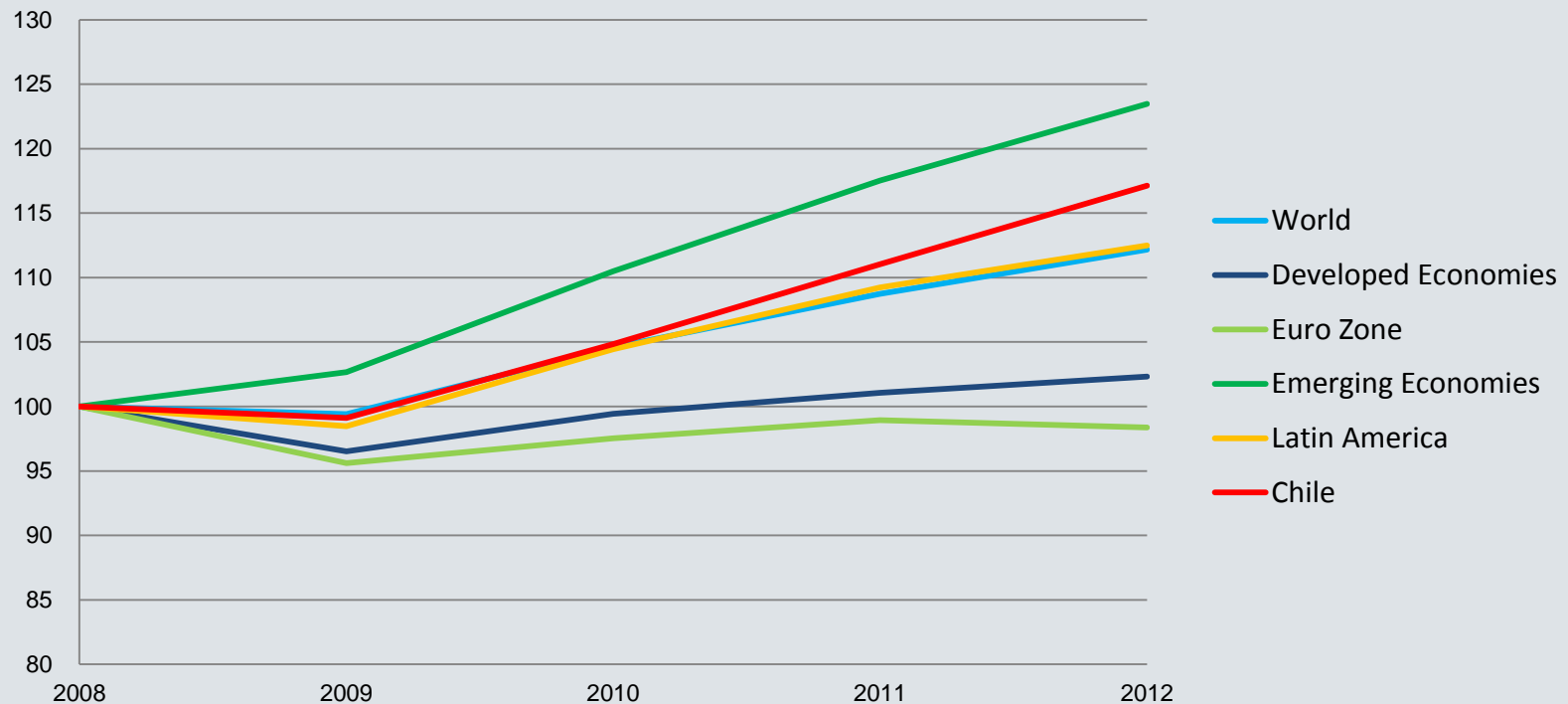

(GDP 2008=100, real GDP)

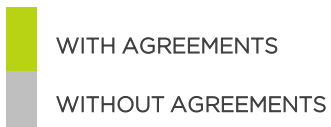

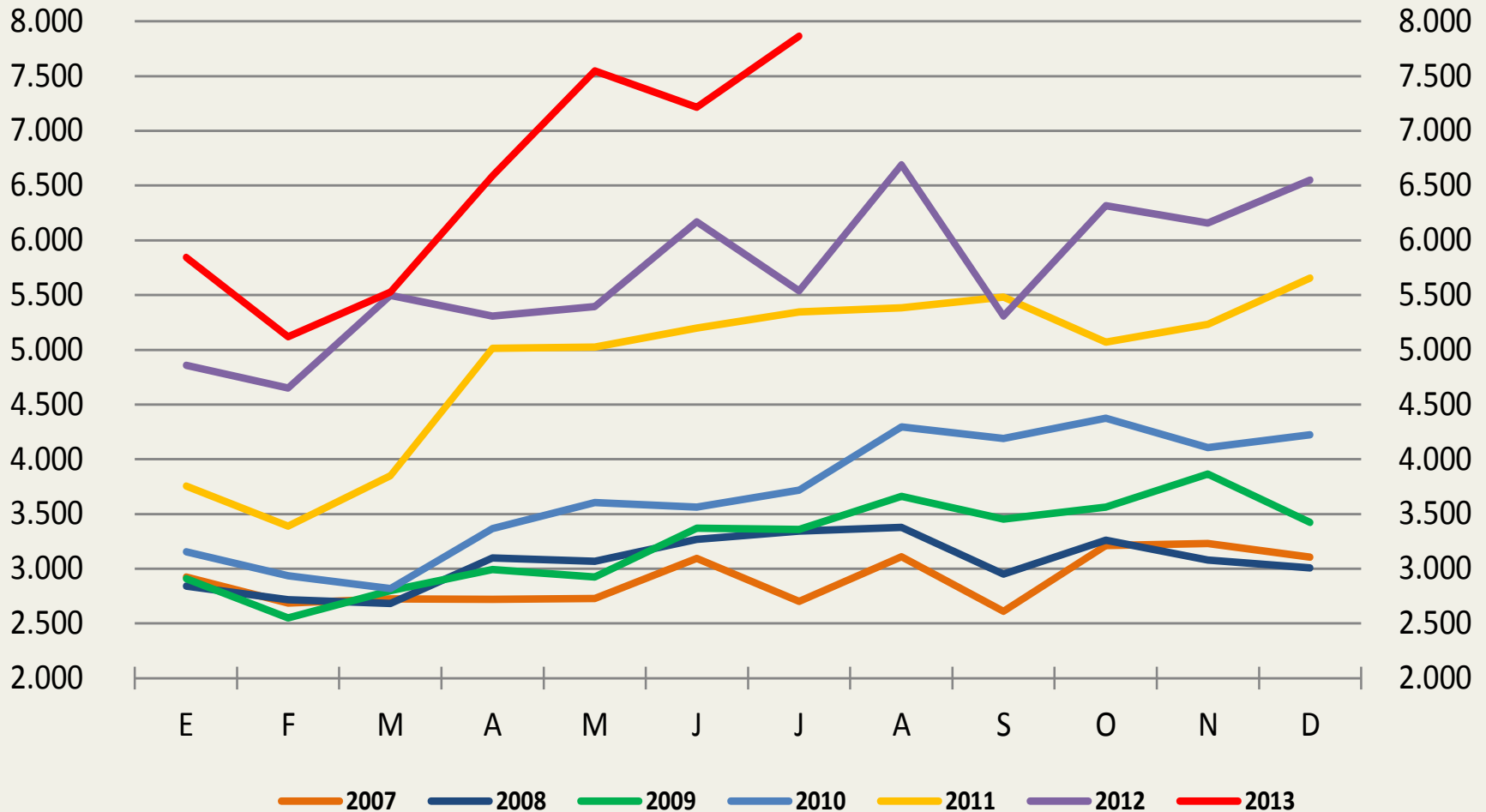

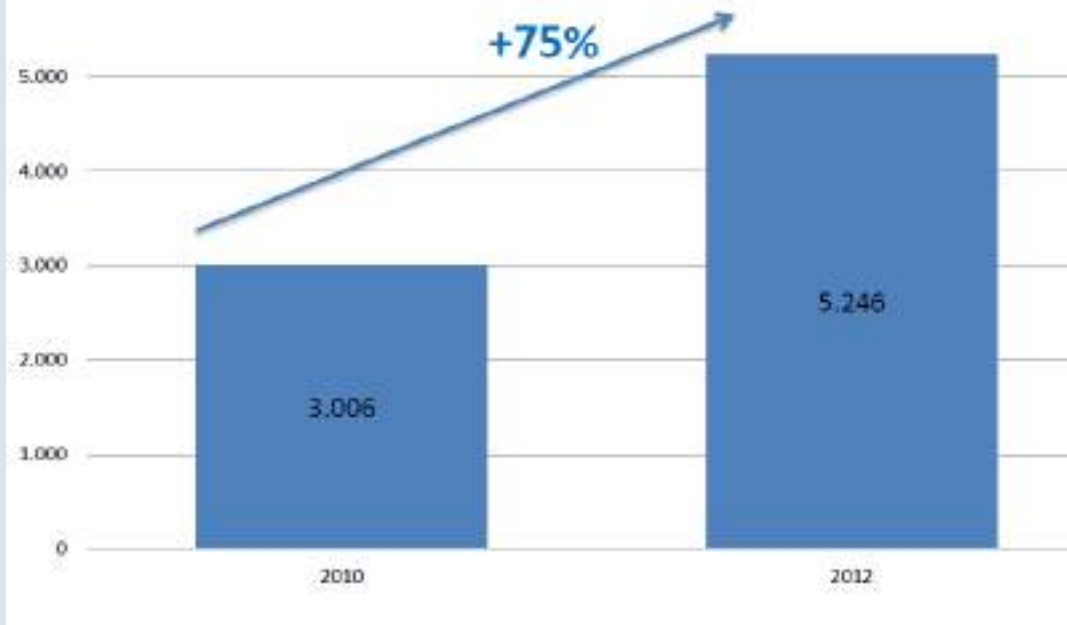
Sociedades Constituidas

Call it the Chilecon Valley or call it crazy. In 2010, the Chilean government launched Start-Up Chile's revolutionary pilot program in the hopes of positioning Chile as the innovation and entrepreneurship hub of Latin America.

To tackle this enormous task, the Chilean government created an incubator that offers entrepreneurs \$40,000, office space and local support in exchange for moving to Chile for six months to build their company. This is one of the few programs in the world that offers bootstrapping entrepreneurs financial support without taking equity.

At its inception, the unique government program had been lauded internationally in publications such as Forbes, The Economist, iMC, megazine, and EXAME, but how is it doing today? And, most importantly, is it working?

Three years and 584 entrepreneurs later, the program seems to have reached its adolescence — and not without its fair share of growing pains. After all, the program is a start-up itself. “We are a start-up for start-ups,” as executive director, Horacio Melo explained. “We have to pilot and grow just like the start-ups in our program because we are a start-up too.”

As Start-Up Chile begins its seventh class this summer, the program has to overcome a number of challenges to reach their next round of goals. It has already hit some major milestones. In the last application round, ending April 9, the program received 1,577 applications from 68 different countries — an 80 percent increase from the amount of applications from the first generation.

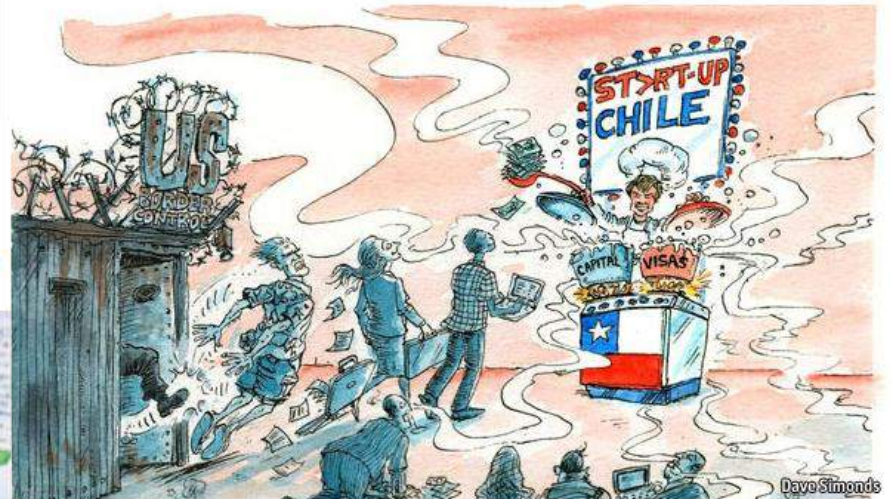

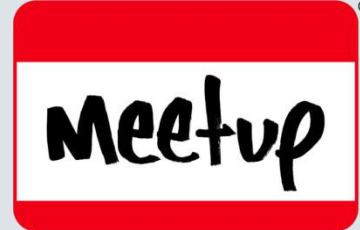
